## VILLAGE OF OTTER LAKE STREET ADDRESS NUMBERING ORDINANCE ORDINANCE NUMBER 26

An ordinance to require the posting of address numbers to assist police, ambulance, fire department and other public safety agencies to locate those in need of assistance.

## THE VILLAGE OF OTTER LAKE ORDAINS:

- Section 1. Each dwelling or other principal building on a parcel of land within the Village shall post the street address numbers on the building.
- Section 2. Whenever the building on which the street address number is posted is located more than 150 feet from the center of a public road, the owner shall also post the street address number at the point at which the driveway or private road inters the public road.
- Section 3. In the event that there are 5 or more residences on a private road, a sign indicating the range of street address numbers may be posted in the lieu of posting each individual numbers.
- Section 4. Each posted street address number shall consist of numerals at least 3 inches in height.
- Section 5. Whenever a new dwelling or other principal building is constructed the street address number shall be posted at the time construction is commenced.
- Section 6. Any property owner who fails to post or maintain the posting of street address numbers shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Upon conviction thereof, the violator shall be liable for a fine not to exceed \$100.00, plus costs of enforcement and prosecution.

The undersigned President and Clerk of the village of Otter Lake hereby certify that this ordinance was adopted by the Village Council on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of February, 1992 and was published in the Lakeville Millington on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1992 and will become effective 30 days after date of publication.
