

VILLAGE OF OTTER LAKE
CURFEW ORDINANCE
ORDINANCE NUMBER 8

An ordinance to regulate the hours that minors under the age of 18 years may be in or on the public streets, alleys, or parks; to prescribe penalties for violations; and to repeal former curfew ordinances.

THE VILLAGE OF OTTER LAKE ORDAINS:

- Section 1. No minor under the age of 14 years shall loiter, idle or congregate in or on any public street, alley, or park between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., unless the minor is accompanied by a parent or legal guardian, or some adult delegated by the parent or guardian to accompany the minor.
- Section 2. No minor under the age of 18 years shall loiter, idle, or congregate in or on any public street, alley, or park between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., unless the minor is accompanied by a parent or legal guardian, or some adult delegated by the parent or guardian to accompany the minor.
- Section 3. No adult shall assist, aid, abet, allow, permit, or encourage any minor to violate the provisions of this ordinance.
- Section 4. Any person violating this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00 and/or imprisonment not to exceed 10 days.
- Section 5. Severability. This ordinance and the various sections, sentences, and clauses thereof, are hereby declared to be severable. If any section, sentence, or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby.
- Section 6. The curfew ordinances effective on December 23, 1962 and November 21, 1976, are hereby repealed.
- Section 7. This ordinance adopted by the Otter Lake Village Council at a meeting duly called and held on the 16th day of October, 1978. This ordinance shall take effect 30 days after the date of publication.
