

VILLAGE OF OTTER LAKE
DISORDERLY PERSONS ORDINANCE
ORDINANCE NUMBER 9

An ordinance to prohibit certain acts committed by disorderly persons; to prescribe penalties for violations; and to repeal inconsistent ordinances.

THE VILLAGE OF OTTER LAKE ORDAINS:

- Section 1. No person shall make profane, obscene, rude, or insulting remarks in the hearing of any other person while in or on any public streets, alleys, parks, or other public places within the Village.
- Section 2. No person shall remain or loiter upon any private parking lot, driveway, sidewalk, alley, privately owned business or industrial establishment without the consent of the owners or for any purpose not connected with the business conducted on the premises.
- Section 3. No person shall loiter on sidewalks, streets, or other public property so as to hinder the passage of pedestrians, or to interfere with people lawfully going about their business.
- Section 4. No person shall engage in any brawl, affray, fight, or disorder in any public place.
- Section 5. Any person violating this ordinance shall be deemed a disorderly person and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00 and/or imprisonment not to exceed 30 days.
- Section 6. This ordinance and the various sections, sentences and clauses thereof, are hereby declared to be severable. If any section, sentence, or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby.
- Section 7. The Disorderly Persons ordinance adopted December 3, 1962, and any other ordinances inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.
- Section 8. This ordinance adopted by the Otter Lake Village Council at a meeting duly called and held on the 11th day of October, 1978. This ordinance published as required by law on the 24th day of October, 1978. This ordinance shall take effect 30 days after the date of publication.
